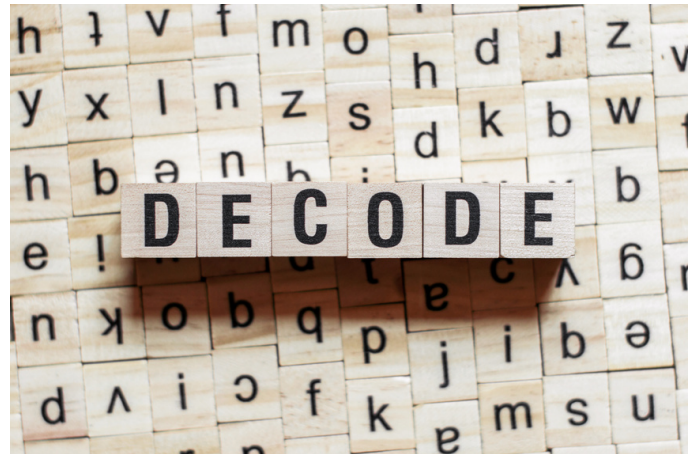

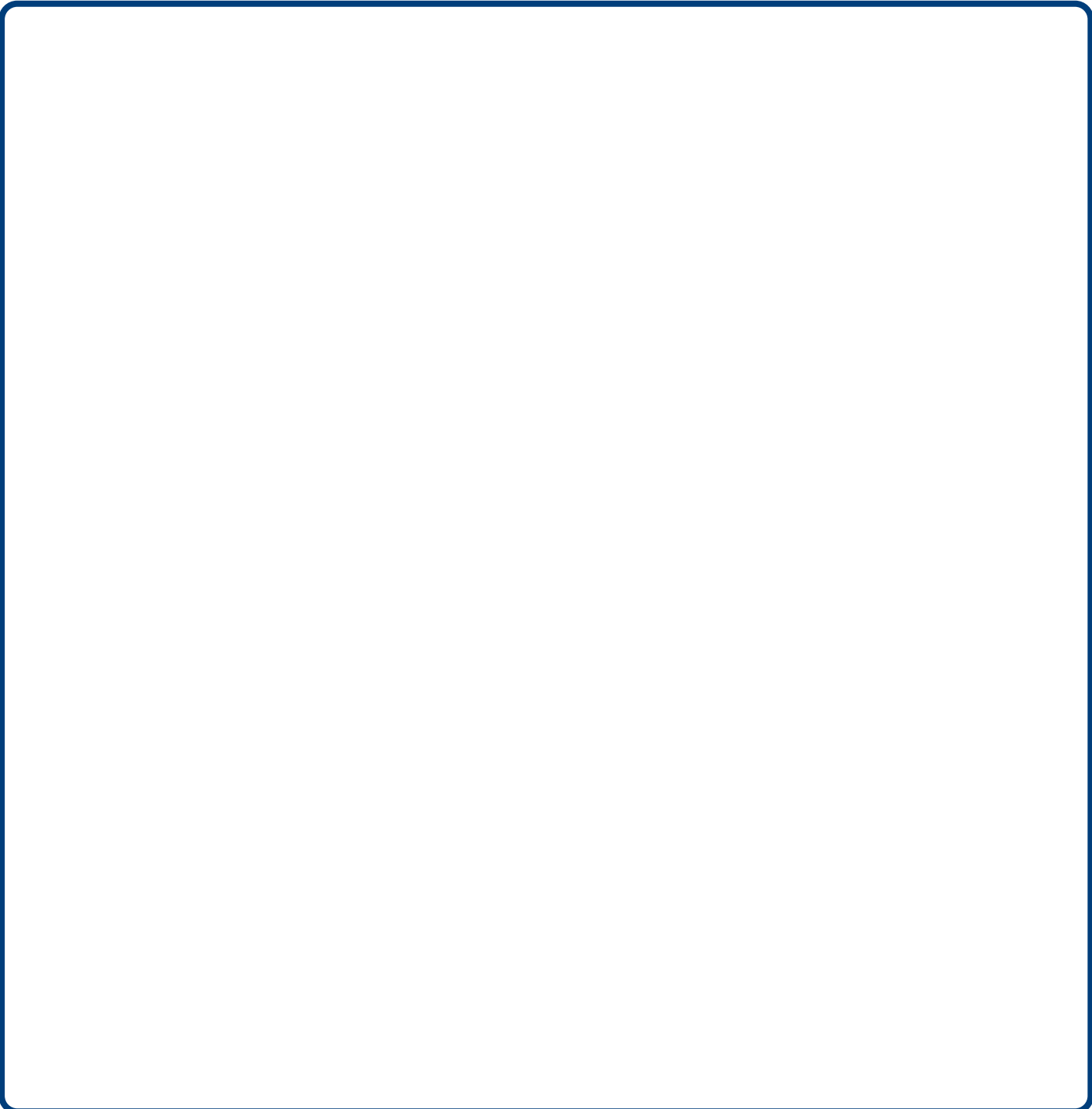

Align these values with potential job roles in cybersecurity.

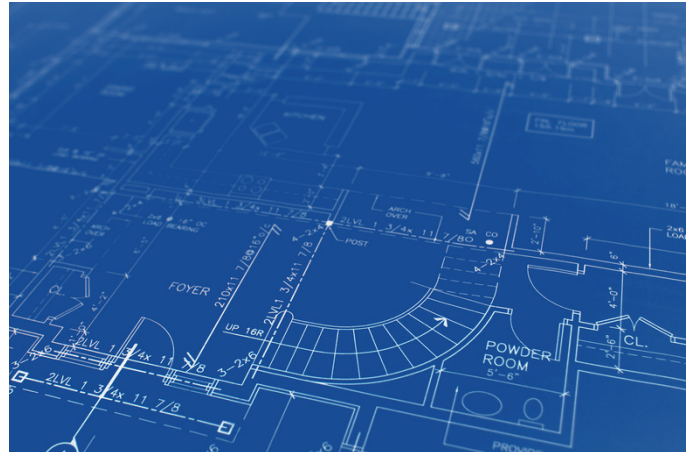

TOOL 5: MULTI-TOOL

1

Preparation

Prepare 6 sheets of paper, each labelled with one of Holland's six career personality types. Lay the sheets on the floor or tape them to the wall.

2

Role Sorting

Write down roles, tasks, or skills you enjoy on small cards or post-it notes. Place these cards on the sheet that best aligns with each role or task.

3

Party Time

Imagine you're at a party where each sheet of paper is a different room. Walk from 'room' to 'room,' and decide where you'd spend the most time, the second most, and so on.

4

Code Creation

Create your Holland Code based on where you'd spend the most to least time. For example, if you like Investigative the most and Social the least, your code might be 'IREASC.'

5

Analysis

Use your Holland Code to explore careers or educational paths that align with your interests.

6

Next Steps

Investigate real-world opportunities that match your Holland Code. Could be courses, job openings, or networking events.

INVESTIGATIVE

Curious thinkers who enjoy research and exploring patterns

ARTISTIC

Creative individuals drawn to self-expression and originality

SOCIAL

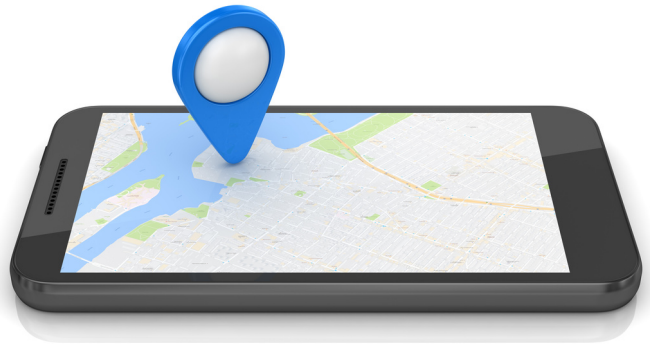
